Prez Corner.....Kathie Butts

I am so pleased that we have been able to resume business as usual after this long pandemically altered year. Many thanks to, and much admiration for, the shelter staff. They made it happen.

When then Governor Bullock declared that we were/are an essential service, we had no idea what was coming. We stayed open for the year. No small feat without the financial benefit of being able to fundraise. The Boards of Directors that came before us, did a fabulous job of investing wisely and creating an endowment fund that supplements operating monies. Your donations were gratefully received and with the reserves we had - we got through that exceedingly difficult year.

Governor Bullock's decision that we provide a service essential to our county and valley got me to thinking about who we serve and how many families provide homes to animals in our area. I found some great information from the American Veterinary Medicine Association. In the United States there are approximately 76 million dogs and 58 million cats, our primary shelter guests. Dogs live in approximately 48 million US households and cats live in approximately 31 million households. Using the formula provided by the AVMA and a very unscientific estimate of Ravalli County population, I believe somewhere around 22,000 to 25,000 households in the County have at least one companion animal These families help keep our valley a healthier and happier place by limiting animals at large which reduces dog bites, potential attacks on farm animals, dog packs and sick animals on our streets. Sick animals often lead to people

being treated for rabies.

And as our population increases so will the households with pets. Many of the folks new to Ravalli County expect a level of county services equal to counties that operate with



sales tax, higher property taxes, and impact fees. Our county leaders have historically recognized the income limitations of the folks who live here and have resisted these methods of collecting funding. Rather, we enjoy the work of many non-profit organizations. It is clear that the Bitter Root Humane Association and the animal shelter it provides are an important part of living here and the need for our shelter will grow in the foreseeable future.

We have 2 pressing needs. One is to replace our operating reserves. The other is to begin to substantially reduce the mortgage we will have on the new building. We have raised three quarters of the funding needed for the building and have additional loan funding from Trail West Bank. Our pandemically altered year has raised our awareness of the need to eliminate as much of that mortgage as quickly as possible. We are asking for your help. Your Donations of \$5 to \$50,000 dollars or more..... are very much needed and appreciated. There are multiple ways to donate, many are tax advantaged. To learn more, contact the shelter or any member of the Board of Directors. Fundraising efforts are coming back in full swing and with your help we can get back to normal. Thank you!

Manager's Corner.....by Rachel Kramer

My favorite time of the year has arrived...Kitten Season! Although fostering kittens is rewarding, it is also very exhausting! BRHA Foster Program is a critical component of shelter management. At any given time, we can have 30 to 70 kittens in foster care, including several "bottle fed" kittens that are with staff 24-hours a day requiring specialized care.

Our program is designed to place kittens in foster homes within 24 to 36 hours of arriving to the shelter. Kittens are so fragile and their immune systems are susceptible to illness if placed in the shelter environment.

This year our kitten season will be like no other year. We are preparing to move into our amazing new shelter that has been a dream of many for the past 15 years. We are working out of boxes, with part of them in the new shelter while others are still in the old shelter. The staff has proven to be resilient and continues to place the welfare of animals in our care as their number one priority.

Some tips to remember if you find abandoned kittens; you may have good intentions but removing kittens greatly reduces their chance of survival. Mama cat may be off searching for food. It is not unusual for mama cat to be gone for several hours or she may be in the process of moving them to a different location. Kittens can survive several hours without food as long as they are warm. Kittens should only be removed if they are in immediate grave danger or if they appear to be very sick.

If you are considering adopting a kitten this year you may want to adopt two kittens. Two kittens are actually less work. Their youthful energy is placed on each other and they become more well-adjusted pets.

Volunteers



As a Volunteer Coordinator, the biggest challenge I've faced in the past year was the limit placed on recruiting new volunteers. While the interest from the public to volunteer at BRHA did not wane in the slightest, my ability to say "Yes, Welcome!" was cut down at the knees, which disappointed all of the inquiring folks and left staff at the shelter scrambling to do all our tasks with a very minimal team of current volunteers. Social distancing guidelines meant that volunteers could not help out in our small kitchen while at the same time the construction of our new shelter eliminated several play yards for the dogs and volunteers to socialize. But, as the timing of COVID and construction left BRHA equally in the lurch, the completion of our new shelter and

the lifting of COVID restrictions have aligned for us to be able to say WELCOME BACK, VOLUNTEERS! We are opening up recruitment of new volunteers at this time, which we are so excited about! We are accepting applications for all positions and as we figure out our volunteer needs in our new shelter, more positions will be created and announced. A few of our current needs and those that might be needed in the new shelter are as follows: Advocats (cat socializers), dog walkers, dishwashers, laundry helpers, grounds cleanup and maintenance, transporters, errand runners, window washers, bunny socializers, office assistance and much more!
