#### This is the story of Scratch.....

Scratch came to the BRHA a little before Halloween, he was found on I-90 outside of Billings and was a sad little emaciated mange covered puppy. You could see his soul right through his eyes which spoke of experiences that were beyond what most people think of when they think about puppies. He was covered with demodectic mange, a rarer type of mange requiring special baths and medications. His case was a generalized one and the mange covered most of his skin surface. He scratched non-stop when he was admitted to our shelter, that's how he got his name.

He was so hungry, everyone that worked at the shelter kept a treat or two in their pocket – Scratch couldn't be in the general population because of the mange, which put him in the back hall and conveniently he was in the main flow of our staff as they went about their work. Those pocket treats all became his.

It was evident that he recognized he was in a secure and safe place where he could have all the time he needed to heal both his body and his spirit. The animals who come to our shelter are never put down for time or space. We treat them individually for everything we can change for the betterment of the animals. Our staff is made up of individuals who truly care about our animals. They are the second ingredient in how that mangy puppy became the magnificent dog, the first reason was the folks who stopped and picked him up. Thankfully they saw that he was homeless and in need of help.

Our Animal Care Attendants are special people, they work hard at giving every animal a chance to shine their brightest so they can find the family or the person to become their people. Our staff healed the mange, they healed the hunger, they taught him to sit and they taught him to play. He would look embarrassed whenever he pooped inside his crate, I heard one of our senior animal care people tell him "It's not your fault, don't be embarrassed, when you get to a bigger space it will be just fine." And it was.

Then came the last ingredient and the most important one. Scratch got a family and a new name! He got all that right around Christmas. It turns out he loves the snow, he loves long walks, he loves pinecones and grassy weeds. He got a family with kids, and a family with plenty of room for a dog in their house and in their hearts. He is about to go on his first road trip....... It is obvious from his after photo, he got a great future.

If you ever doubt the good that the Bitter Root Humane Association does in our community stop and think about this puppy. He touched the hearts of the people who picked him up, the people who work at the shelter, the veterinarian who helped heal his mange, the huge number of people who inquired about him and the four people who took him home. He is not a dog running in a pack trying to kill your chickens, he is not the terrified dog that will bite you if you try to help him. He does not know the sheriff deputies who see him running in the night.

I am so proud to be a small part of the BRHA in the 50<sup>th</sup> year of helping the Bitterroot Valley's animals and by helping the animals, also helping our neighbors.

#### What is a Kangal....by Linda Williams

A Kangal is a shepherd, a dog which is a breed of large, livestock-guardian dogs that originated in Turkey. The males can weigh up to 138 pounds when full grown. They are also called Anatolian Shepherds in the United States.

We got our first Kangal – Ahou – in July 2021. A Female, 5 years old, not spayed and a dog used for breeding. Ahou was a sweet lady, but she didn't like other dogs, even her own pups. However, she loved her people, and she became a favorite of our staff.

In October seven of Ahou's puppies were surrendered to us. They were six months old – Xena, Golden Boy, Bruiser, Athena, Amos, Bowser, and Artemis. Six months old weighing already 70 plus pounds, untrained, never on a leash, unsocialized, not neutered or spayed, etc. Our staff worked with these dogs every day to get them trained to leash, and some commands. Keep in mind these dogs have a mind of their own – they know what they need to do to, they need to guard the flock, but probably not sit, stay, etc.



So, what do we do with these magnificent dogs, to make sure they find the right forever home? Our employee, Charlotte Springer, did a little research and found a rescue called The Kangal Rescue Project working with 4 Paws Rescue – in Michigan – run by a wonderful woman, Caryn Robinson.

Caryn worked her magic. Keep in mind Caryn thoroughly screens possible adaptors to make certain they know how to raise and train these special dogs, and keep them safe with 6-foot fences, and a job to do. She found homes for all 7 puppies and for Ahou, the mother. The Kangal's are now residing - two California, two to Oklahoma, two to Washington and one to Columbia Falls.

The people who adopted these the pups already had experience with the Kangal dog, knowing they needed 'a job to do – a flock to guard' – to be their friend to teach them the ropes. That's what happened. We are so fortunate, so lucky to have people all over the country who respect these special animals, want them in their lives, know what they need, and are ready give it to them.

By the time our 7 pups and Mom left us, they were all spayed and neutered, had all their shots, and microchipped. They went to their forever homes with people who know how to handle them – who gave them their job – guarding their animals/flocks. Some guard the potbellied pigs, some guard the chickens and sheep, etc.

We know how happy these beautiful animals are, doing what they were meant to do in the first place...."Happy Tails" - Kangals!











#### Where are they now....Duke aka "Kangal #7" Golden Boy

Hi Bitter Root Humane Association Team.

Remember us?!?! The Lyons family who flew from CA to pick up Golden Boy who we now call Duke. We wanted to send an update on how Duke is doing now that it has been about a month since he has been home.

Well, Duke and his big sister Layla are inseparable, unless they are eating -- they both REALLY love their food and Duke eats so much faster than Layla that he will eat his food and hers and still want more.

Duke is ~100 lbs. and as sweet as can be. He is learning his place on the farm, and learned really quickly that chasing goats will get you head butted and chasing pigs will get you bit (#lifelessons). Layla does a great job of correcting Duke when he chases the animals by grabbing his back leg and forcing him to fall down.


Duke is a super star on his leash and goes on hikes with me every day, which makes Layla super sad so now I have to bring 2 - 100+ dogs with me on my hike and I basically go nowhere because they each have a mind of their own.
